## Military Plans Go Astray As The Monsoon Arrives

"Man the Umbrellas!" Another military exhibit has been drowned out!

A few of the outside displays remained, but some, like the radio direction finders and walkie-talkies had to "walk" under the shelter of Ross Hall.

Aggies are naturally familiar with military equipment, such as that shown to visitors Saturday, but they might not be familiar with the impression of the show received by a visitor.

Among the equipment that weather the storm were some big guns, technically called 90 and 40 m. anti-aircraft and a 155 m.m. howitzer. These olive green weapons protectively watched over Ross Hall while visitors were allowed to view the exhibits inside.

Assembled in the building and also sponsored by the Military Science Department was a collection of arms including revolvers and rifles. Some of the pistols had ivory grips, others fancy hand-carved wood. Silver engraved handles adorned a few of the rifles. In the collection was one gun, a snipe's rifle, which was labeled a snave's rifle.

The Society of American Military Engineers exhibited a sand pile in which they had modeled a military road construction and showed the various stages of location, clearing, drainage, earth work, subgrade and surfacing.

The sand pile was complete even to the point of having cute little toy trucks showing the actual process.

Another exhibit showed models of a floating bridge, a Bailey bridge and pontoons built over a small "river" which was dammed on one end. Other exhibits included a display of rigging, knots and lashings, demolition and mines, which might have been put out to scare harmless "C" reporters.
