Trustees Accuse Minister Of Selling Church Building

Fort Worth, Tex.—Trustees of Meadow Park Baptist Church here accuse their pastor of selling the church building and refusing to leave the parsonage when discharged.

Named in the civil property suit are the Rev. Kenneth A. Miller and his wife, Ola.

The trustees say Miller was relieved of duties last Nov. 27 but continued to live in the parsonage. They claim he sold the church building, which they said was on land donated by two church members.

The pastor, in cross action, claims he established the church and built the \$5,000 parsonage at his own expense. He said the church building was an army surplus structure and was sold to satisfy a mortgage.

The trustees also accuse their former minister of renouncing the Baptist faith. He denies this.

ORDNANCE NO. 144

An ordinance making it unlawful to discharge any firearm within the limits of the City, defining firearms, and providing a penalty.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLLEGE STATION: 1. It shall be unlawful to shoot a firearm within the limits of the city. 2. A firearm shall include specifically but not exclusively any shotgun, pistol, rifle, air rifle, B. B. gun, or any other mechanism that discharges or ejects any bullet, buckshot, or any other metallic object of any size by force of combustion, mechanism or air.

3. Anyone violating this ordinance shall be guilty of misdemeanor and upon conviction shall be fined not less than fifty (\$50.00) dollars nor more than fifty (\$50.00) dollars.
