It's hard on Mike's parents, Mr. and Mrs. Henry M. Kilpatrick, but Mike has courage and the will to win. When he became ill a week ago Monday physicians didn't expect him to live. Yesterday he was able to swallow a little through his paralyzed throat. He's looking forward to complete recovery and already knows what he will do.

"First thing I want is a pony, and then when I grow up I'm going to be a doctor so little boys like me won't have to be sick with this old polio," Michael tells his parents and nurses.

Slim Premiere Crowd Sees Land Grant School Tribute

Members of the college faculty and staff and a gathering of six hundred students saw unfolded on the Guion Hall screen last night a pictorial tribute to the Land Grant College of the nation.

The occasion was the Texas premiere of "Waves of Green," a technical presentation by the Dearborn Motors Corporation of Detroit.

The 40-minute film did a creditable job of telling how the American farmer has, through the utilization of the scientific and mechanical advances in agriculture fostered by Land Grant Colleges, advanced to his present world status.

Judged by Hollywood standards, the picture could not be rated very highly. But judged on the basis of what it is, a semi-educational film produced by the makers of the Ford tractor, "Waves of Green" indeed deserves praise.

Especially noteworthy is the fact that, though the film was produced by a private corporation, it makes no attempt to sell that company's product. Ford tractors and Dearborn farm equipment are used liberally in the film, but only as background.

Local scenes and persons both appear in the film. The efforts by E. S. McFadden that led to his development of the Hope variety of rust-resistant wheat receive considerable mention. McFadden's earlier work in the Mid-West and his subsequent work with wheat rust in the Southwest are both pictured.
