## Grade Points Start Flying As Final Exams Commence

The last lap of the 1949-50 school year is here. Those dreaded finals have finally caught up with those not lucky or brilliant enough to exempt.

Final week begins tomorrow Saturday May 27, and ends with conflict exams on Friday June 2. The regular final week is divided into ten examination periods, each of which is designated by an alphabetical letter. These letters when tacked on the section number of each course will tell when the exam for that section and course will be. The ten periods for this semester are as follows:

## Retail Trade Increases 254% In Nine Years

Brazos County's retail trade has gone up 254 per cent over the figure nine years ago, according to the U. S. Department of Commerce.

Taken from the 1948 Census of Business, the figures cover the period from November 15, 1939 to November 15, 1948.

Retail sales during 1948 in the county totaled \$28,700,000, an increase of 254 per cent over the \$8,100,000 business transacted in 1939. County wholesale figures totaled \$7,100,000 in 1948, as compared to \$4,600,000 nine years previous.

Service trades included in the census recorded receipts of \$1,400,000 in 1948 compared to the 1939 tabulation of \$480,000—a million dollar gain.

Employees in the county rose, too, over the period. A combined total of 2,143 employees in the service trades have been reported with 1,205 in the earlier year.

Retail businesses numbered 384 in 1948. Unincorporated establishments made up 373 of this number, with the total including 123 food establishments, and 73 eating and drinking places.

There were 26 wholesale and 120 service establishments in 1948, along with 14 amusement enterprises.

## Howell Beats CS Merchants

Scoring half of their runs in the third inning, the Howell Lumber Company softballers took an 18-9 win from the College Station Merchants last night at Sue Haswell Park.

In the Commercial "A" League game, the Lumbermen scored their large total with the aid of only one home run, using plenty of solid hits to put their men on base.

The Merchants got off to a fast start and, at the end of the first inning, lead the Lumbermen 3-1. Three runs in the second for the Bryan team gave them the advantage, after which they scored their nine runs. The scoring spree left the Merchants without opportunity to reach the Lumbermen.

Howell's home run came in the fifth inning, when shortstop Lampe poked the four base hit.

## Brazos River Dam Hearings Opened

Washington, May 26—UP—The Power Commission said today it will start a hearing here June 8 on the proposal of Brazos River conservation and reclamation district to build three dams on the Brazos River in Texas.

The district, a Texas State Agency, has asked the Commission to find that the proposed project will not affect interstate or foreign commerce.

The dams, in Palo Pinto and Hood counties, would be known as Turkey Creek, Inspiration point and De Corva Ben Dams.

The Commission said a preliminary investigation by its staff indicates that interstate or foreign commerce may be affected by the proposed development.

The district said the dams will be operated solely for power purposes, with the power to be marketed entirely within Texas.
