anticipated. The schedule will be completed later.

ORDNANCE NO. 144

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF COLLEGE STATION:

- It shall be unlawful to shoot a firearm within the limits of the city.
 - A firearm shall include specifically but not exclusively any shotgun, pistol, rifle, air rifle, B. B. gun or any other mechanism that discharges or ejects any bullet, buckshot or any other metallic object of any size by force of combustion, mechanism or air.
 - Anyone violating this ordinance shall be guilty of misdemeanor and upon conviction shall be fined not less than fifty \$50.00 dollars nor more than fifty \$50.00 dollars.
