# Baptist Bible School Enrolls 133 Students

The Vacation Bible School which holds classes at the First Baptist Church in College Station has a total of one hundred and thirty three members enrolled in its four divisions, according to the Reverend R. L. Brown, pastor of the First Baptist Church.

The school is under guidance of Rev. Brown, who is the vacation school principal. Classes for the vacation school started on the seventh of June and will come to a close on Friday, June 30, at 11:00 a. m. when Communion will be held, the pastor announced.

Commencement exercises are to be held in the church auditorium with all the parents and children taking part in the program.

The vacation school is for young people of all ages and follows generally the program outlined by the Baptist Sunday School Board of Nashville, Tennessee. Classes are held from 8:30 until 11 each morning at the Baptist Church.

General officers of the vacation school are Mrs. R. L. Brown, general secretary; Mrs. E. N. Bennett, assistant secretary; Mrs. L. V. Hanna, devotional leader; Mrs. Marion Pugh, beginner department superintendent; Mrs. L. P. Dulaney, primary department superintendent; Mrs. L. R. Adams, junior division superintendent; and Mrs. Guy Gann, intermediate department superintendent.

Of the 133 members enrolled in the vacation school, 49 are in the beginners department, 37 in the primary department, 35 in the junior department, and 14 in the intermediate department, Rev. Brown said.

The public is cordially invited to attend the commencement program Friday night at seven o'clock in the church auditorium, Rev. Brown added.

All women who belong to a family of present and former A&M System employees, and women employees themselves, are eligible for membership.

The first meeting of the Social Club will be held on the fourth Friday of September of next year, announced Mrs. James C. Miller, president of the club for the past year. This, however, is a new ruling, since in years before the club has started the year in October.

The organization is divided into six interest groups. Mrs. H. W. Barlow has been the chairman of the swimming group this year. Mrs. J. H. Hill and Mrs. R. W. Steen were co-chairmen of the neighborhood book group. Co-chair-
