Unburdened of confusing flashbacks and windy harangues by psychologists who would seem more at home at a seance, "In A Lonely Place" keeps a tempo vivace throughout. Writing is terse and crisp and clever, and the camera is never arty or obtrusive—it's just around to show you what's going on as simply as possible.

As to the venerable Humphrey, his interpretation of Dixon Steele is his best screen job in two years. He at last seems to realize that he's no glamour-boy like Montgomery Clift, but that his success lies solely in his peculiar brutal appeal.

High School Paper Now Being Printed

The Round-Up, A&M Consolidated High School's newspaper, is being published for the twelfth consecutive year this semester. This is the first year since Anne Boddie was editor in 1945 that the paper has been a printed publication.

During the five years between 1945 and 1950 the paper was either mimeographed or published with the aid of a ditto machine.

Consolidated's paper, with its circulation of 400, has subscribers in places as distant as Tennessee and Massachusetts.

The paper is completely self-sustaining. Revenue to meet operating expenses is acquired through the sale of advertising and subscriptions.

Staff Meets Tuesday
The staff meets every Tuesday to turn in their copy for that week and to receive their assignments for the following week's issue.

Deadline for advertisements and pictures for Friday's paper is Monday.

As the school does not have a journalism class, the paper is produced by students who are interested in journalism and who are willing to sacrifice some of their spare time. An English teacher, Mrs. J. T. Duncan, is the sponsor for the paper and helps in the editing.

Editors are chosen for one year in an election by the student body. Interested students run for the staff positions of news editor, society editor, sports editor, and layout editor. The students who are elected, meet with the other prospective staff members and these prospective members elect the editor-in-chief from the four editors chosen by the student body.

The editors for the coming year are editor-in-chief, Dorothy Bates; news editor, Helen Boatner; society editor, Martha Jane Arnold; sports editor, Frank Vaden III; and exchange editor, Barbara Sims.

One of the papers most widely read regular features is their weekly selection of the student of the week. In this feature a brief biographical sketch and history of

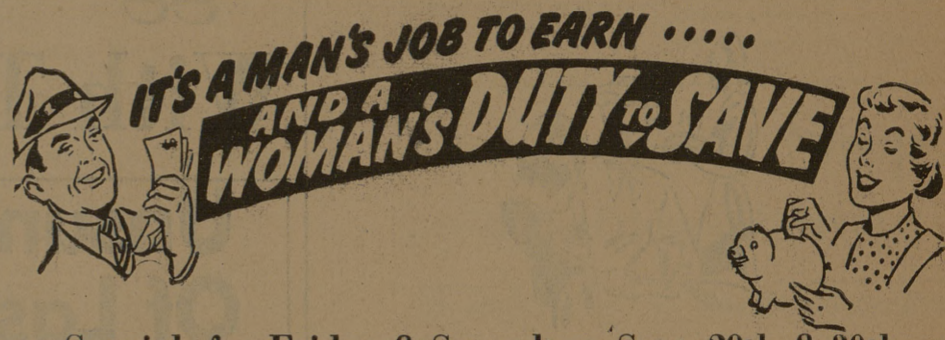
