In a tense home game, their first of the year, A&M's Consolidated Tigers were handed their third defeat of the season and their second by North Zulch.

The final score in the varsity game was North Zulch 45, A&M Consolidated 30.

Somewhat hampered by the fact that Coach Othel Chafin was ill and could not attend, the Tigers nevertheless rallied around temporary coach L. E. Boze, Consolidated principal.

Jackson, Rodgers High

Bobby Jackson and Royce Rodgers were high scorers for the Tigers with eleven and ten points, respectively. For the first time this year, Jackson played a good game, as did David Bommen, who sparkled on defense. North Zulch had a sharp player

in forward, Milton Wiese, who swished the basket for fifteen points.

Although he hurt his knee early in the third quarter, Guard Bobby Williams, Consolidated football star, rang up three points.

B Team Wins

Consolidated's B team knocked off the North Zulch B team to the tune of 24-18, after being defeated 42-28 by the same team last Tuesday night.

The B's have also lost to the Navasota B's by a 27-19 score.

Last night was the first time that the new clock and scoreboard had been used in the Consolidated gym.

High scorer for the B's was Fred Anderson with eleven tallies. Luzon Beauchamp and Pinky Cooner tied for second honors with six points apiece.

A&M's All-Conference End Andy Hillhouse ranks fifth behind Baylor's Harold Riley in the pass receiving game, who is the No. 1 man with 539 yards gained on the 35 aerials that he has smuggled.

Andy has pulled in 24 of the Aggie aerials for a net gain of 482 yards and six touchdown counts to make him the highest scoring end in the conference.

Four Cadets figure in among the leading scorers in the ramble-scramble SWC.

Here's that man Smith again! Bob leads the 11 scoring stars in the conference with a total of 84 points for the 14 times that he has crossed the double stripe. Texas' Townsend could tie Bob this week-end if he should score 12 points against LSU.

The other Aggies who rank in the scoring column are Hillhouse, Larry, and Tidwell, all of whom are tied for seventh place with 36 points apiece for the six times that each has crossed into the promised land.

merely speaks of some Communist armed forces." US delegate, Warren Austin, US delegate, merely said the security council had been prevented from acting by the Russian veto and the assembly now should deal with this important and urgent matter.

Austin said the proposed item "puts before this assembly one of the greatest questions faced by the United Nations. It may involve the whole future of the United Nations. It may involve the peace of the world. All the processes of the United Nations should be invoked in an effort to put an end to this threat to world peace."
