

Friendship Appeal Made By Acheson to Reds

Washington, March 22—(AP)—Secretary of State Acheson appealed today for friendship from the Soviet bloc peoples, but advised them that while Americans "covet peace, we will not sell our souls for it."

"The peace we seek, is not simply the absence of war but a sound and free collaboration among nations in a pattern of responsibility based on mutual respect," he said.

"The great structure of peace which the United States and its allies are building will never be complete until all the peoples now under domination by the Kremlin participate in full partnership."

Acheson's statement was in letters to Senate and House Foreign Affairs Committee chairmen extending strong administration support to a resolution reaffirming American friendship for all other peoples. The resolution, sponsored by Senator McMahon (D-Conn) and Rep. Ribicoff (D-Conn), specifically names the Soviet people.

Acheson also included the people of China, "now suffering the tragedy of life behind the Iron Curtain."

The resolution calls on Russia to transmit the bid for friendship to the Russian peoples, and Acheson said this points to the Kremlin's opportunity for "setting affairs on a better course."

"A start could be made," he suggested, "by letting the truth flow freely into and within the Soviet Union."

With the friendship plea the secretary coupled the statement that the West is determined to create the kind of peace he described. Acheson said that in the past year the western nations have made progress toward that end.

Asked for an assessment of the world situation on the first day of Spring, he said he thought the situation of the West is stronger and better than it was a year ago in both Asia and Europe.

dish until the stems are tender. (avoid over-cooking all fresh vegetables!) Season with salt and butter and serve.

For the cupcakes, line a pan of 12 muffin tins with cup cake holders (these may be purchased at most ten cent and grocery stores, keep the cakes in shape and avoid all chance of the cakes sticking.) Use this recipe, which is quick and very simple.

Sift together 1 1/4 cups flour, 3/4 cups sugar, 2 teaspoons of baking powder and 1/2 teaspoon of salt into a mixing bowl. Drop in 1/2 cup of shortening (either margarine or a fine grade of fat.) Mix 1 1/2 minutes (with mixer, or 2 minutes by hand.) Add 1/2 cup milk, 1 1/2 teaspoons vanilla and 1 egg. Mix 1 1/2 minutes again. Bake in moderate oven for 20 minutes, or until done. Cool and top each with a frosting made by melting 5 ounces semi-sweet chocolate with 2 tablespoons margarine over hot water. Add this gradually to 1/4 cup sifted confectioners sugar. Add dash of salt and 2 or 3 tablespoons warmed top milk or cream (use until of good stirring consistency). Top cakes. Add to each an English walnut or pecan half.
