Baptist Church begins at 9:45 Sunday morning. The Rev. O. Byron Richardson, pastor, will speak at the morning worship service at 10:50.

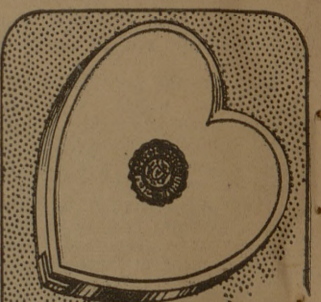
