

Operation Of Basic Division Explained By Dean Bertrand

"The objective of the Basic Division is to aid students in the transition to college study at A&M and to help make adjustments to college life," Dr. John R. Bertrand, dean of the Basic Division told members of the freshman class recently.

"We want to make available to you the benefits of a planned program of educational and vocational guidance, administered by professionally trained personnel. This program is designed to better prepare you to make an intelligent choice of course of study and re-

lated school activities," the speaker continued.

Curricula Requirements

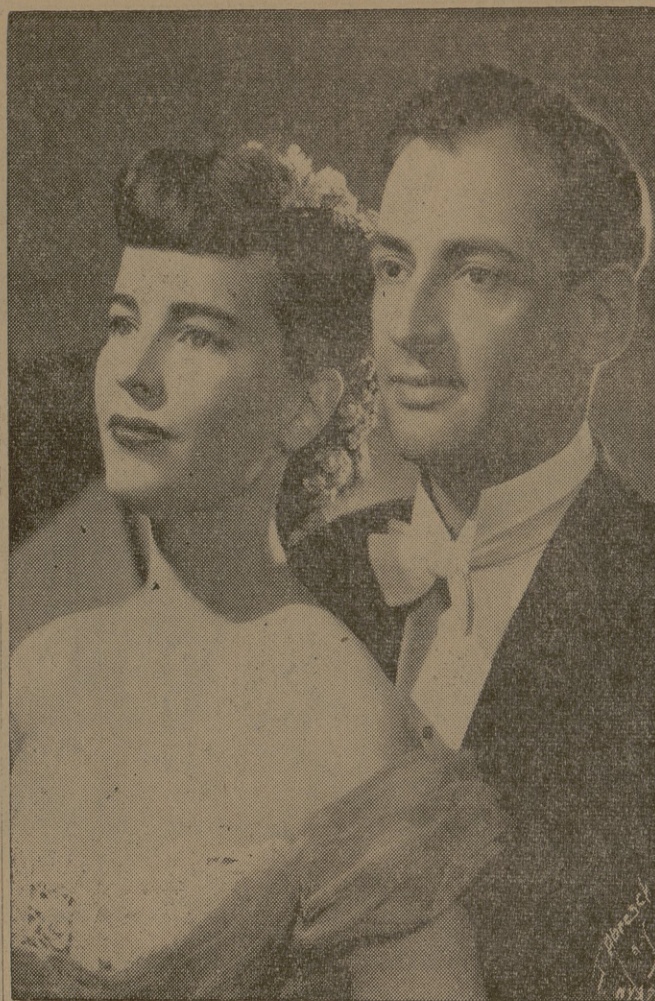
The Basic Division is designed to furnish the student with an opportunity to gain insight into the educational requirements of the various curricula. Dr. Bertrand told the freshmen that his faculty would try to help them in the development of general study skills or in specific subject areas.

"Our goal, insofar as the degree granting schools at A&M is concerned, is to help you to become qualified to pursue the training necessary for professional competency and mature citizenship," said the speaker.

Multi-Opportunities

While enrolled in the Basic Division, opportunities for both individual and group guidance is available for the student. The results of the aptitude, achievement, and interest tests which the freshmen are required to take, in addition to their high school accomplishments, are utilized by the department to help the student know himself better.

Speaking to the second class to enroll in the Basic Division, Dr. Bertrand enjoined the freshmen to "use us to help you prepare yourself to 'perform justly, skillfully and magnanimously' all the offices, both private and public, of peace and war." The speaker took the latter portion of this statement from Milton's definition of a complete education.

THE GRADUATE SCHOOL

GRADUATE STUDENTS BRING ADMIS-SION LETTER OR COURSE OF STUDY TO REGISTRATION.

In order to avoid difficulty in registration each graduate student who has an officially approved course of study is reminded that he must bring it to the registration. Each graduate student who does not yet have an approved course of study must bring his letter of admission to the Graduate School which outlines the work he proposes to undertake and any background or prerequisite work which is required of him.

Each member of the Graduate Faculty who is signing up a graduate student for one of their courses should call for and study these papers. This will help to make sure that the student is properly guided in taking courses in their most logical sequence. It will frequently avoid the trouble which arises when a student fails to take a course this semester which may not be offered again within the next semester or so, thus completely disrupting his program and sequence of training.

It is also pointed out that a study of such material will materially assist the faculty member in determining whether or not a student has the necessary background and prerequisite training for successfully taking a particular graduate course he requests.

The Graduate School asks the cooperation of both graduate and faculty members in passing this request on to other faculty members and graduate students so that they may come to the registration desk properly prepared.

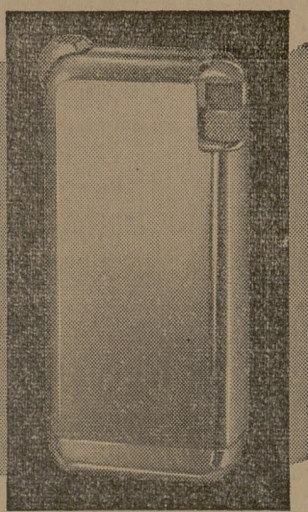
Youth needs God—needs a deep sense of the Infinite and Eternal in human life. The churches of this community are endeavoring to meet this need.
