ing classed scholastically deficient as opposed to last year's ten hours and ten grade points.

An important new regulation covers the eligibility of a senior to apply for a degree. A senior must be able to complete his required number of grade points without making over a 1.5 grade point ratio in his last semester to be eligible.

The last change that will affect students this semester is the new final exam schedule. All exams

will be taken according to the hour at which the class is met and all conflicts will be eliminated. Exams for courses with only one lecture hour will last one hour according to the new regulations and the exam will be given during the last regularly scheduled lecture period. All other exams will still be three hours in length.

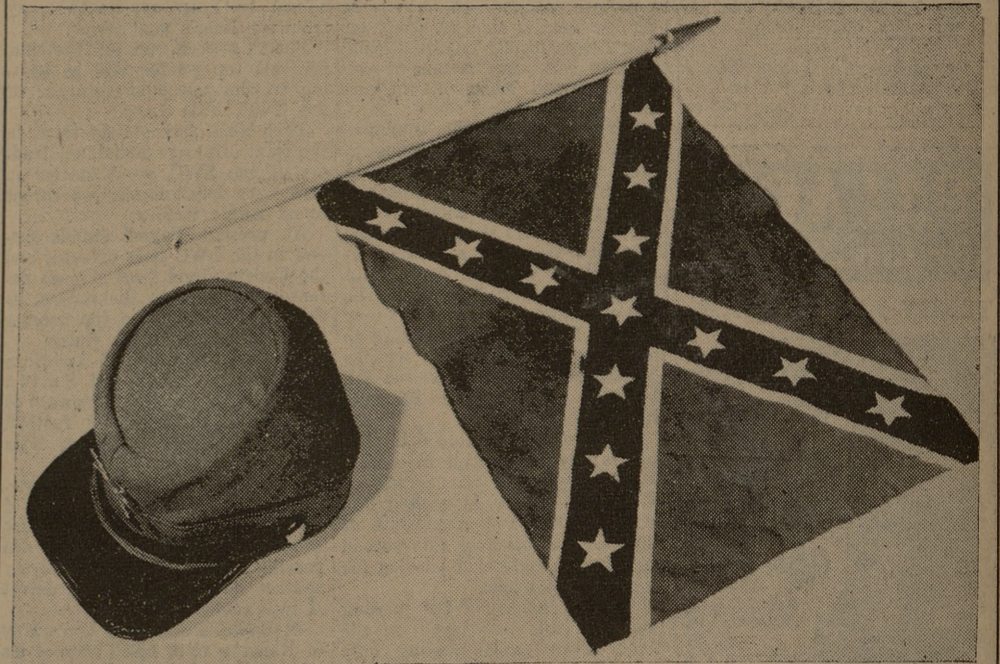
