Next Tuesday a mobile unit of the Southeast Texas Defense Blood Center from Beaumont will be on the campus to collect blood for use on the battle fields in Korea.

Within two days after the Aggie donor gives a portion of his blood, it will be available for use in Korea. The blood is transported to the west coast and from there to the fighting front.

There is no greater way for those of us at home to show the men who are on the front lines that we are behind them. 
Aggies to offer theeir blood for defense. Late last night there was 151 men who signed on the dotted line, saying they were willing to give blood.

Requirements for blood donors are simple. A person has to be 21 years of age-or under 59. If the men are under 21 they must have the approval of their parents.

The remainder of the requirements are relatively simple -a person just has to be in good general health. A list of the particular qualifications are on the front page of today's paper.
