the role together with their abilities as actors result in a quality of acting seldom seen on the American screen.

Background music attains the ultimate objective of all such works. It does its job of setting moods without becoming so obvious as to be distracting.

"Streetcar" is a sensitive portrayal of a fading Southern beauty trying to return to the standards and the way of life she has once known.

Blanche Du Bois, played by Miss Leigh, is forced to live with her sister and brother-in-law in the poorer section of New Orleans after losing her school teaching job due to an affair with one of her young pupils.

Brother-in-law Steve Kowalski, played by Marion Brando, is irritated by the pretensions of the aging Blanche and is determined to hurt as much as possible.

Steve's cruelty begins with insults and crude remarks, building slowly towards the destruction of the pitiful romance Blanche is having with one of his friends. The sadism ends in a rape of

Texas Pecan Crop Lower Than 1950's

The Texas pecan crop is 69 per cent less than the 1950 crop according to Fred R. Brison, professor of horticulture.

Texas pecan production, forecast at 12,000,000 pounds by the bureau of agricultural economics on Nov. 1 is the same as was indicated a month earlier. However the crop is the smallest since 1942.

As usual, a large proportion of the crop will come from wild or seedling trees. The forecast is for 10,000,000 pounds of wild or seedling pecans which is 73 per cent below average, Brison said.

"Streetcar" is presented against the background of the squalor and loose morals of New Orleans' French quarter. Although the camera is able to span time and distance, the audience gets an impression of the cramped quarters in which the Wowalskys live.
