The Cotton Bowl contestants have lost a total of eight games this year, but both are colorful and will probably provide one of the best games of the day.

Kentucky with a seven won and four lost record is ranked 15 in the nation while TCU with a six won and four lost is ranked 11 in the nation by the Associated Press.

Vito Parrelli sparking the Kentucky club has been nominated on several All-American selections and was third in the voting for the Heisman Award.

TCU ably directed by the sophomore sensation, Ray McKown, has not been held scoreless all season using the Meyer spread with great success.

Baylor Bears travel to the Orange Bowl on New Year's Day to meet the Engineers from Georgia Tech. Larry Isbell of the Bears received All-American honors from Look Magazine and was a unanimous choice for All-SWC will lead the SWC team in the battle.

The Engineers have a slightly better record than Baylor with only one tie on their slate while Baylor has one defeat and one tie.

Baylor has Isbell and two fine ends which should be a winning combination.

**Ordinance No. 167**  
An ordinance entitled "The Traffic Code of 1951" defining words and phrases; prescribing regulations; providing for procedure and methods of traffic control; providing for reports of accidents; prohibiting driving under influence of drugs and prescribing a penalty therefor; prescribing driving rules; providing for safety measures in turning, starting, signaling, and stopping; prescribing right of way; providing for pedestrians' rights and duties; regulating special stops and restricted speeds; regulating stopping, standing, and parking; miscellaneous rules; regulating equipment on vehicles; providing for inspection of vehicles; prescribing a penalty for violation of this ordinance; prescribing procedure upon arrest; prescribing an effective date; repealing all ordinances in conflict herewith; and providing a saving clause.

**Ordinance No. 168**  
AN ORDINANCE CALLING FOR SPECIAL ELECTION  
WHEREAS, by a vote of two-thirds or more of its members, the City Council selected and appointed a charter commission consisting of eighteen (18) members to prepare a proposed charter for this city; and  
WHEREAS, said Charter Commission has completed its work and has approved and recommended a proposed charter for adoption by the qualified voters and sets January 8, 1952, as the date for a special election to be held for the purpose of allowing the qualified voters to pass on said proposed charter; now therefore,  
BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of College Station, Texas,  
1. A special election shall be and is hereby ordered to be held on January 8, 1952, for the purpose of enabling the qualified voters to pass on a proposed charter for the City of College Station, Texas, as prepared and submitted by the City Charter Commission.  
2. Ballots shall be prepared so that voters may vote "For the Adoption of the Charter as prepared by the City Charter Commission" or "Against the Adoption of the Charter as prepared by the City Charter Commission."  
3. Polling place for said election shall be the City Hall. The following persons are hereby appointed as election managers: L. G. Jones, Mrs. C. B. Godbey, and Mrs. H. E. Burgess.  
4. The polls shall be opened promptly at eight (8) a. m. and closed at seven (7) p. m. The provisions of the laws of the State of Texas governing election shall be observed and only qualified voters shall vote. Notice of said election shall be posted in three public places and published in the official city newspaper.

freedom their full freedom. No such joy will be possible as long as the British persist in remaining in the Nile Valley.

Historians discern a parallel between an incident in early American events and the present dispute between Egypt and Great Britain.

In the year 1844, when the Republic of Texas, after eight years of independent life, was attempting to find entry into the Union of the United States, the British were against it.

Their Minister to Texas offered every inducement, and pointed out that Texas cotton would be welcome to the Manchester mills.

The attempt to sway the political fortunes of the southwestern republic, peopled as it was by pioneers of American blood and American instincts, failed, and Texas came into the Union on December 29, 1845.

Today, it is pointed out, Great Britain seeks new areas to furnish her manufacturing economy with the cheap cotton she so sorely needs. Here, it may be said, is precisely her interest in the wide and fertile prairies of the Sudan.

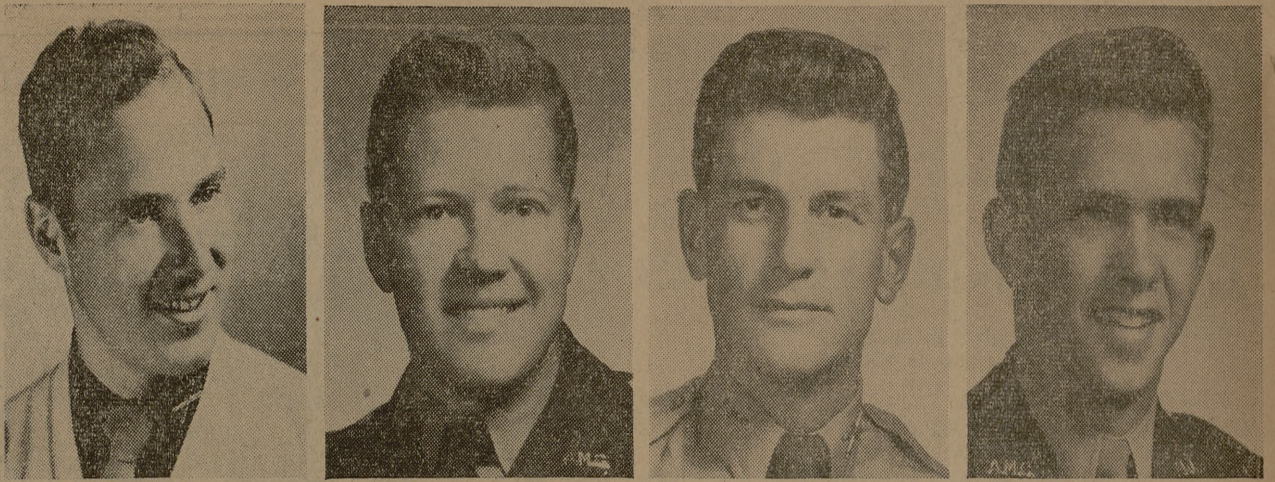
