
nostly cloudy skies and warmer emperatures and east and southcentral Texas Monday with the cloudiness increasing and still warmer temperatures Tuesday.


Partly cloudy skies and rising last year had unsafe brakes. temperatures were on the weather agenda for west Texas and the north central portion of the state Monday and Tuesday.
