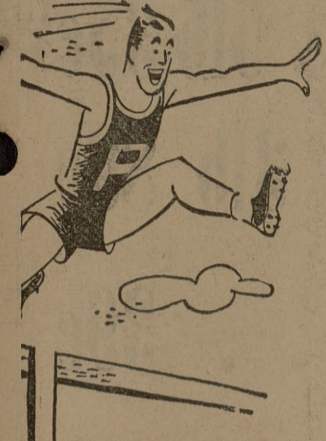

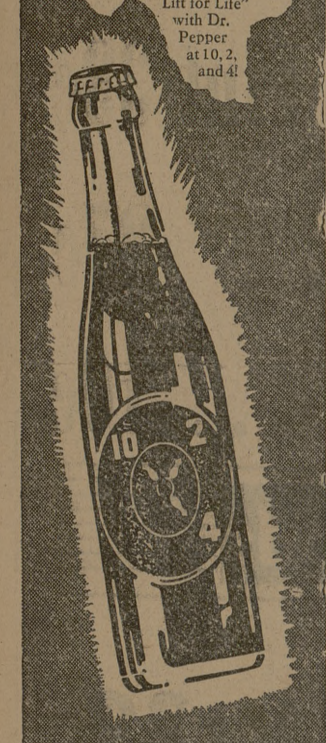

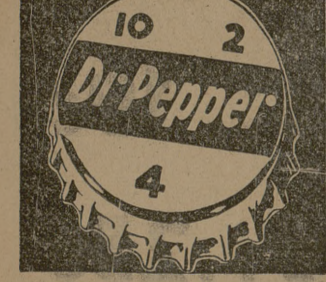

Rogers said all citizens of College Station were invited to be present.

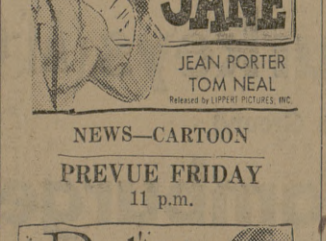
