## Ags Rest During Finals; Play U of H Friday Night

This week the Aggies will take a break while exam weeks is scheduled; however, the practice days continue.

The Cadet five will work out this week in preparation for their return battle with the University of Houston.

Houston will be the cite of the second meeting of these two clubs this year. In their first encounter, the Cougars stepped on the Aggies 38-29.

Houston guard Bell paced the scorers with 10 points while Buddy Davis, Aggie center, got 11 for the Cadets. Royce Ray scored 9 for the visitors.

#### Now Tied for Second

When they played the first time the Aggies were in a deep hole, going on to lose five straight before they broke the winner's column. Now the Cadets are tied with the University of Texas for second place, trailing behind unbeaten TCU.

Friday night was Jewell McDowell Night and if you don't believe it, just ask the Baylor basketball team.

McDowell scored 23 points to ring down the curtain on his college basketball career which was almost half of the entire total points the Aggies made in downing the Bears, 47 to 36.

McDowell played the entire contest and had three Bruins trying

to guard him, Strasburger, Cole and Brown.

Starting slow, McDowell scored only one point in the first period, then scored five in the second quarter. Picking up steam, McDowell dropped four field goals through the bucket for eight points in the third quarter and 10 in the final quarter.

A total of 49 fouls were called on both teams amid the boos of disgusted fans. Two fouled out for each side, and the rest of the players had three or four fouls when the final whistle blew.

Ed Houser, playing forward for the cadet quint, kept the Aggies in the game during the first two periods, with his excellent floor play.

Tall, Buddy Davis was the sec-

ond highest scorer on the Farmers five and until he fouled out in the fading seconds of the third quarter, controlled the backboards.

In the preliminary game between the freshman teams the Aggie Fish were downed 30 to 45 by the Cubs. The Cubs were hot, while the Fish were minus the services of forwards, Robert Johnson and Bob McCulloch.

College of Texas, College Station, Texas, until 2:00 p.m., February 1, 1952 and then publicly opened and read. Sales will be for cash to the highest bidder. A separate price is to be bid on each building selected by the bidder. The bidder may stipulate what buildings he will purchase in the event he is high bidder on more than one building. A cash deposit will be required with each bid to insure that bidders will make payment of the purchase price within 10 days after notice of award is received and will remove the buildings and clear the sites. The College reserves the right to reject any or all bids.

The structures to be sold are: 20 poultry houses, frame construction with corrugated sheet iron roofing, some on concrete slabs and others with dirt or wooden floors; approximate sizes as follows: four 20' x 20', one 16' x 18', eight 14' x 14', six 10' x 10' and one 4' x 12', located on the old College Poultry Farm on Farm Highway 60, west of the College; One two story barn, frame construction, approximately 30' x 45' with attached implement shed (one story frame) approximately 18' x 90', located on the Horticulture Farm on the Farm Highway 60, west of the College, and fourteen poultry houses approximately 14' x 14', construction same as those listed above, located on the old F. & B. Station poultry farm.
