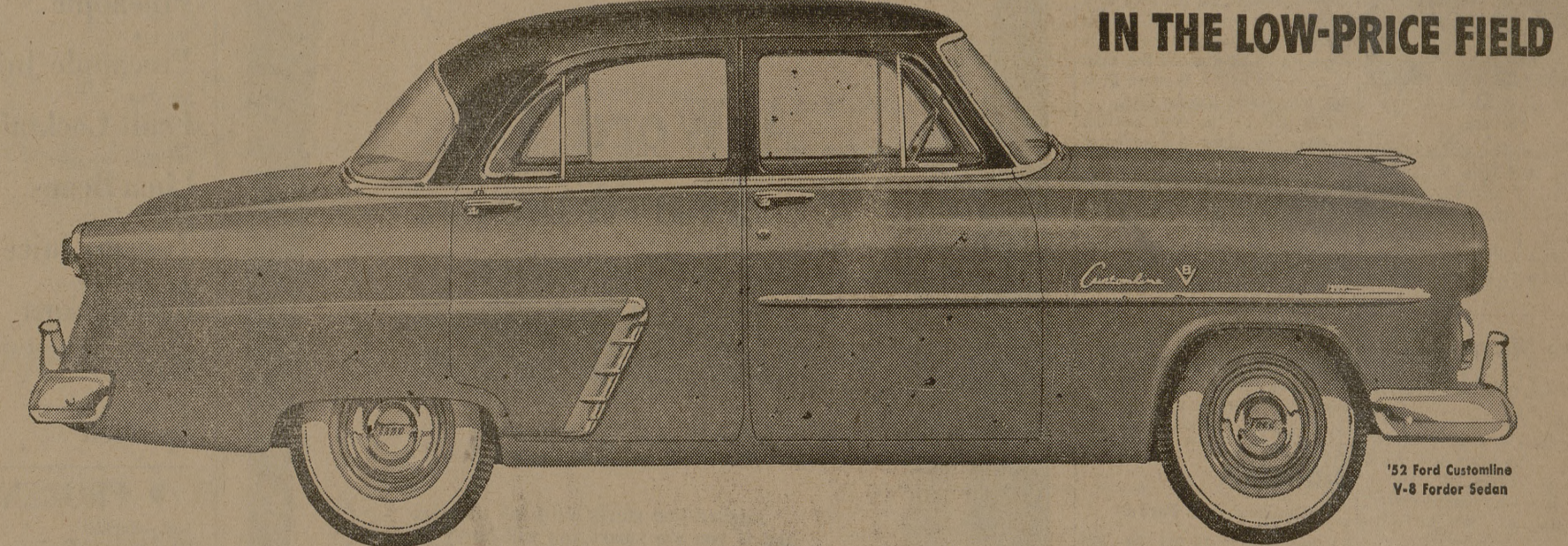
HAZELWOOD ACT EXEMPTIONS

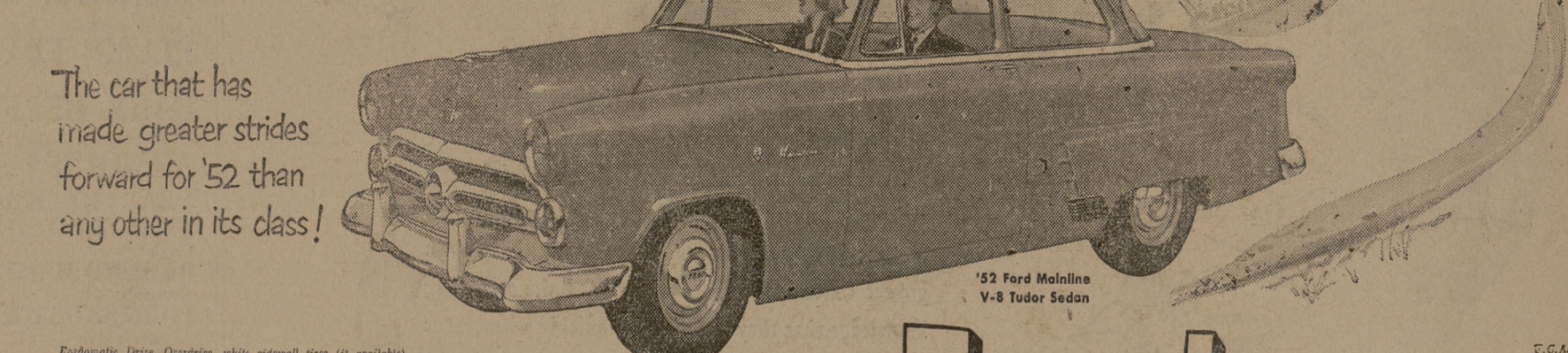
