Frogs Fall To Hogs; Still Tops In SWC

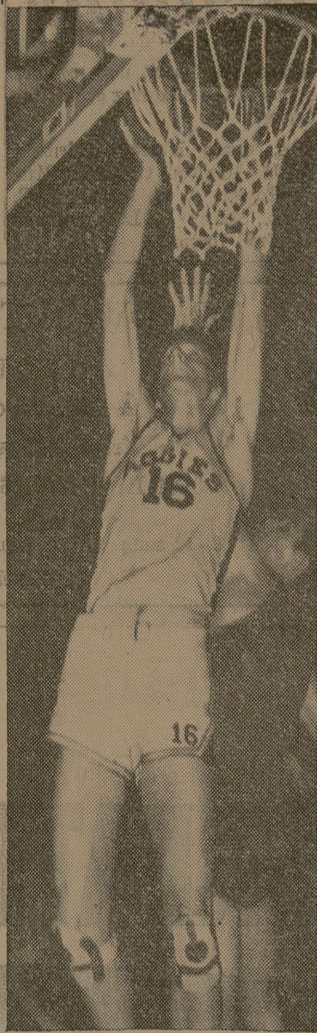
The Arkansas Razorbacks knocked previously unbeaten TCU into a tie with the University of Texas for first place in the SWC championship race Saturday night.

The Hogs jolted the Horned Frogs with a 56-54 setback when sophomore Orval Elkins hit three straight field goals in the last two minutes.

Elkins' final shot came with only 10 seconds remaining in the game. The Arkansas youngster who didn't get into the game until the final four minutes, dumped in a 35-foot two-handed set shot from the left side to cut the Horned Frogs' margin to 54-52, and tie it up with an equally long throw from the right side.

Then, with 14 seconds left, a free throw was awarded to Arkansas' Gene Lambert. He missed, but after the ball was batted around a couple of times, Elkins pushed it in and that was the game.

Fish Lose 41-54

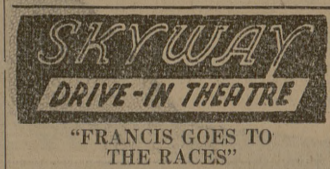
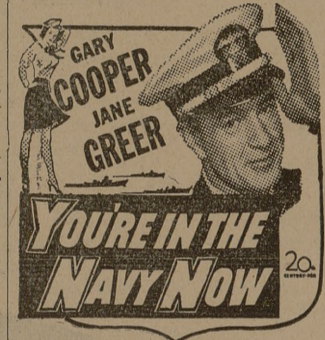
In a pre-game match, the Texas Yearlings beat the A&M Fish 54-41.

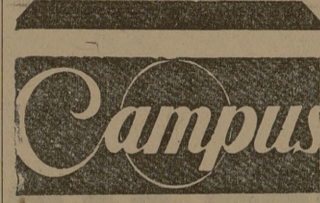
