(Continued from Page 1) in College Station have been set aside for the future development of a business district.

Included in the district is the drive-in theater now being erected by A. P. Boyett on the site east of St. Mary's Chapel.

Milam and Roper, architects from Dallas, have prepared plans and drawings of the business district which allow for the parking of about 700 cars in the district.

**Business Area**  
Architects' ideas for possible developments in the area include such business houses as a super grocery, men shop, coffee shop, cafeteria, variety shop, clinic, cleaners, drug store, beauty shop, filling station, hardware, washateria, hobby shop, gift shop and shoe repair.

Culpepper said the Oak Terrace residential subdivision and the College Hills area are comparable except that it took 13 years to develop College Hills. The realtor said he hoped to build up Oak Terrace in three years.

"There will be no comparison between the extent of the development of the business areas on the two sites," Culpepper added.
