fainting spells or convulsions. All prospective donors who have had recent immunization such as rabies injection in the past year, smallpox vaccination within a few weeks, typhoid, typhus, plague, tetanus, cholera, influenza, and other fever immunizations within the previous two weeks will not

be permitted to donate blood Tuesday or Wednesday. Donors should not eat a heavy or fatty meal within four hours of the scheduled time for their donations, according to Dr. Raymond O. Dart, director of the Blood Mobile. Light refreshments, without milk, cream, butter, mayonnaise, salad oils, fats or fatty meats may be eaten, he explained.
