The earliest and often the most effective religious training a child receives is derived from the little prayer he is taught to say upon going to bed. He is proud when he learns to repeat it without his mother's prompting.

Some of the little prayers of childhood have become classics in many languages. Some have been embodied in song and story and have thus achieved lasting fame.

There is a story of a man who was rescued from tragic death, and later was asked how he felt during his experience. He said that in his excitement and fear he tried to pray, and the only words he could think of were "Now I lay me down to sleep."

Parents face a great responsibility in the rearing of children. The task will be easier and the training more effective if they make the Bible their guide and seek the counsel and cooperation of the Church.
