A&M's First Grid Casualty Reported

The first casualty of A&M football practice this season, regular Guard Marshall Rush, underwent surgery Wednesday on a fractured face bone.

He was injured Tuesday in a head-on collision with a teammate in non-scrimmage workouts. Rush is in St. Joseph's Hospital at Bryan. It is expected he'll be hospitalized five days and it isn't known whether he will be able to play in the Aggie opener with the University of Houston Sept. 20.

Baylor Changes

Waco, Sept. 4—(P)—Coach George Sauer of Baylor has made one major change in his offensive platoon, shifting a left halfback to right end.

The player—Charles Smith of Mount Pleasant, a sophomore—was shifted when fall practice began. "Charley is big, 6-1 and 190 pounds, has good speed, catches the ball well and likes to block," Sauer said.

UT Guard Hurt

Austin, Sept. 4—(P)—Bob Glenn, promising sophomore guard, received an injured knee yesterday in the first real contact work tackled by the University of Texas Longhorns this season.

Dan Page and Dougal Cameron. Defensive standouts were Hub Inghram and Bill Bible, halfbacks; End Bill Georges and Line-Backer Kenneth Anglin.

Rice Injury

Houston, Sept. 4—(P)—Billy Ed Daniels, varsity left halfback from Kerrville, suffered a dislocation of the left shoulder yesterday and will be lost to Rice for at least three weeks.

"With rapid recovery," said Trainer Eddie Wojecki, "he may be ready for the Texas Tech opener."

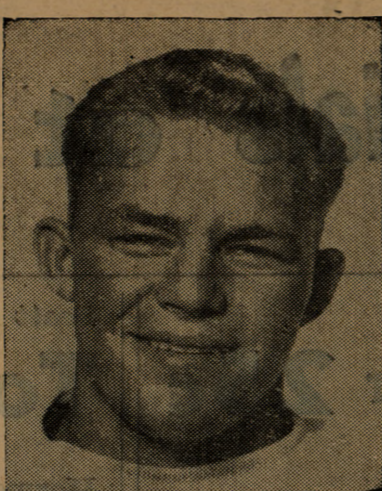
SMU Satisfactory
