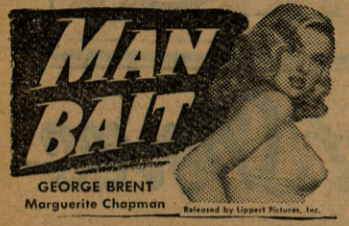
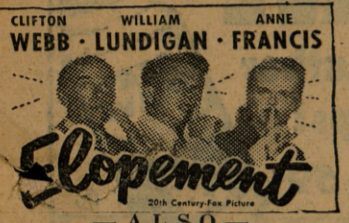

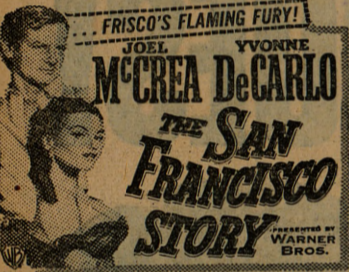

## Aggie Freshmen Meet U of H Tonight In First 1952 Game

The Aggie freshman team will meet the University of Houston freshmen in its first game of the season on Kyle Field at 7:30 p.m. tonight.

Houston's first year men have already played one game, and will have the edge on the Aggies in experience.

Coach Cooper Robbins, A&M freshman coach, has only had his team working out since the 15th of September. Most of this time was spent in weeding out a turnout of 125 boys to a squad of 85.

These last 85 boys will suit-out for the game and each will play

for at least one play, said Robbins.

The score of last week's U of H game with Blinn College game was 38-0. This looks bad for A&M, according to Robbins. It will be a doubly hard due to the fact that the A&M Fish have had only one scrimmage and very little team practice, he added. What little practice they have had was mostly offensive, Robbins said.

"University of Houston has some good, big boys, according to

Robbins. Included are Jim Bourgeois, quarterback, who is a good passer and ball handler; two fast little shifty halfbacks who aren't very big but have most of the scores in the game with Blinn College, he said.

### Long Passes

Many of their scores and big gains were long passes to a couple of good tall ends. They also have a 240 lb. and a 220 lb. tackle, Robbins said.

According to Robbins the probable starting line-up for tonight's game is: left end, Robbins; left tackle, Teague or Clinton; left guard, Millin or Schaefer; center, Connell or Kanoy; right guard, Howell or Blair; right tackle, Zuckewer or Erp; right end, Schroeder or Swan; quarterback, Robbins or Garner; left halfback, Huddleston or Ritshey; fullback, Tidwell, Howell, or Straitt; right halfback, Snead or King.

### Probable Starters

On the defensive team, starters are: Left end, Mangleberger or Bell; left tackle, Schaefer or Nobles; guard, Cook or Cannon; right tackle, McNames or Johnson; right end Hartman or Fox. In the backfield will be Linebackers, Mitchell or Klug; Bass or Shepard; secondary, Walmsley or Mann; Cessum or Zapolek; Watson or Tedder and Nicholson or Burns, Robbins said.

## Cross Country Team Has First Meet of Year

Six cross-country meets have been scheduled this fall by Col. Frank Anderson, track and field coach, and more may be added throughout the season.

Col. Andy, who attended the Olympics at Helsinki, Finland this summer, announced that some of the duals now scheduled may be changed to triangular cross-country events if a third team wants to compete.

The season opens Friday in Austin against the Texas Longhorns. This meet starts at 4 p. m. The season will close with the Southwest Conference meet at Austin on Nov. 21 at 3 p. m.

In between the Aggies take on Oklahoma A&M at Stillwater, Oklahoma University at Norman, Arkansas here, North Texas at Denton and Texas at College Station.

Top men on the Aggie team include Conference Champ James Blaine, a junior; Charles Hudgens, Charles Gabriel, Dale DeRouen and Verlon Westmoreland.

Other contenders will be Edmond Wilmsen, Franklin Whitwell, Orville Albritton, Wallace Kleb and Robert Collins.

Seven team members may be entered in a race but only five are tabulated in the scoring.

"We hope to win this one, but it won't be easy. They will be all out to avenge last year's game," he added.

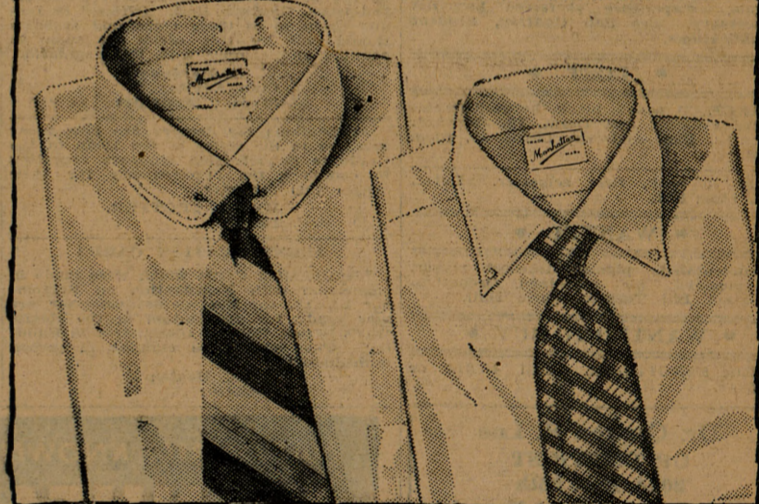
