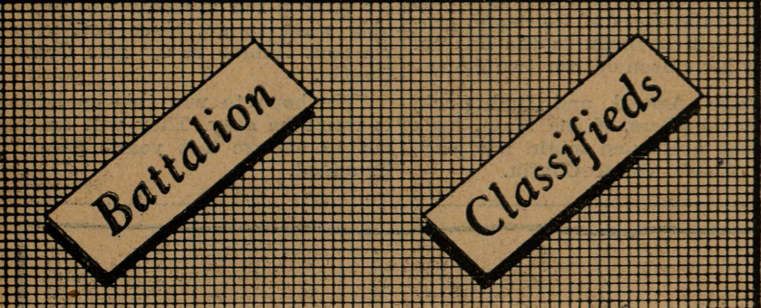


Students to Attend Industry Congress

The National Association of Manufacturers announced today it will invite 49 college students and 17 industrial apprentices to the 1952 Congress of American Industry to be held Dec. 3, 4, and 5, in the Waldorf-Astoria Hotel in New York City.

District of Columbia will have one student at the congress. The 17 apprentices also will represent different sections of the country. Students must be in their third year at a recognized four-year degree-granting college or university. Apprentices must be in their final year of training.

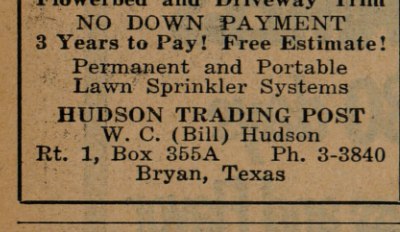
