



Outside the Conference Upsets Due In Grid Program

There will be a shakeup in the rankings after this week-end of football is over, although the leaders, Michigan State, Maryland, and Oklahoma will stay in the first three positions. It will be a week-end of upsets and runaways with the biggest shock coming from the West Coast where Southern California's Trojans will upset the California Golden Bears. Both teams have a perfect record of five straight wins although the Golden Bears are ranked as the number four team in the nation while the Trojans are rated as the number seventh squad. It will be too much defense for the California Blue and Gold with the Trojans upsetting them in a bid for the Rose Bowl, 13 to 6.

Another Reverse

Another reverse will take place in the South as the Virginia Cavaliers down the mighty Blue Devils of Duke. The Orange and Blue Cavaliers have been underrated all season and will surprise the Duke Blue and White 21 to 6.

The Midshipmen of the Naval Academy were trampled by the Terrapins last week, but they will bounce back and down the Pennsylvania Quakers in another surprise, 21 to 14.

Pittsburg's Panthers are due to be stunned by the Mountaineers from West Virginia. The Blue and Gold Panthers are highly rated although beaten by the Sooners while the Gold and Blue Mountaineers are not even ranked. The Panthers figure to be overconfident and upset by the Mountaineers, 13 to 7.

Notre Dames' Fighting Irish have been up and down all season and after their upset of Purdue last week, are due for an upset themselves. Lowly North Carolina's Tarheels will do the trick on the Irish Blue and Gold, 14 to 7.

Oklahoma Rolls On

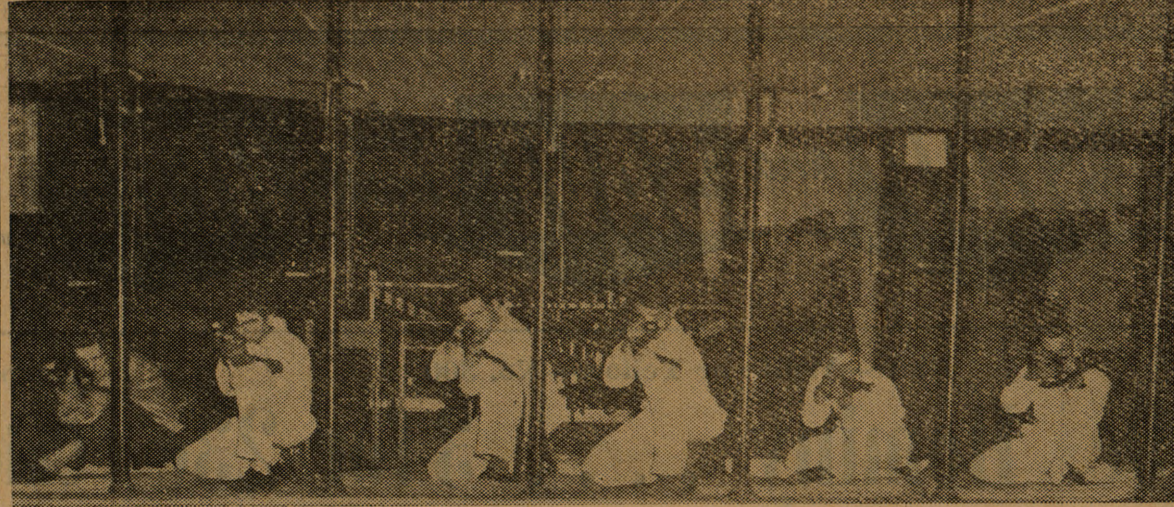

Aggies Meet Leading Offensive Team

A&M pits the next-to-last offensive and defensive record against the Baylor Bears' top offensive and third defensive conference mark in their game Saturday afternoon.

The Aggies have averaged 275 yards per game on offense while the Bruins lead the conference with a 357 yard average. On defense the Aggies have allowed opponents 306 yards per contest while the Baylor team has given up only 246 yards to each foe.

Allen Jones, Baylor's left halfback, is the fifth leading ball carrier in the SWC with 223 yards in 35 tries for a 6.4 average while L. G. Dupre, the right halfback, is close behind with 217 yards in 28 carries for a 7.7 average.

Dupre and Coody

Dupre is a reserve halfback playing behind Jerry Coody, a letterman who was great as a sophomore last season. Last week against the Texas Tech Red Raiders, Dupre carried the pigskin six times for 100 yards.

All three halfbacks are a threat anytime they take the ball and are sure to give the Cadet defenders trouble Saturday afternoon.

Don Ellis, the right halfback, has carried the ball 51 times for 200 yards, to rank seventh behind the Baylor backs while Ray Graves has toted the leather 52 times for 176 yards to rank in the tenth spot in SWC.

Graves has done most of the Cadet's passing, and ranks third in the conference while Baylor coach, George Sauer has alternated with Francis Davidson and Billy Hooper throwing the Bears' aerials.

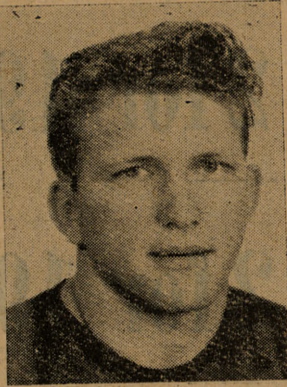
ers, you find that they have completed 32 passes for 579 yards, 40 more than Grave's. The Bears have no individual offense leaders while Graves has 714 yards in five games.

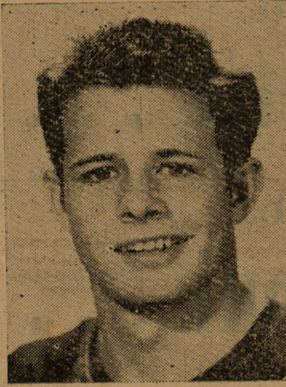

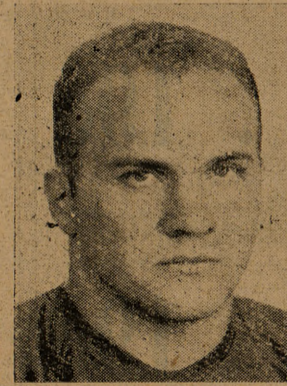
