

# Davis And Others Honored Saturday

The honoring of Aggie Olympic stars will be featured at halftime during the Rice game. In all, four men from Aggieland have participated in the world-wide events.

Darrow Hooper, present star end for the Cadet football team journeyed to Helsinki last summer to put the shot. He took second place to Perry O'Brien from the University of Southern California, whom he had beat in the Olympic try-outs.

Hooper was Southwest Conference champion his sophomore and junior years.

Hooper is a starter on the football team, and does all extra point and field goal kicking.

Davis was an All Southwest Conference center on the basketball team. He is now working with Ada Oil Co. in Houston, and playing basketball for their amateur team. He plans to return to the Olympics in '56.

Jack Mahan in the class of '21, placed sixth in the javelin throw, and was high man for the American squad.

Mahan, who placed sixth in the javelin throw in the 1920 games at Antwerp, Belgium, was high man for the American squad.

As an Aggie, he lettered in freshman football in 1916, earned an Aggie "T" in 1917, 1918, and captained the 1920 football team.

Mahan lettered in track in 1918, 1920, and was selected captain of the 1921 track team.

He was away from school for the 1918-19 term while a member of the armed forces in World War I.
