

INTRAMURAL HIGHLIGHTS

Sq. 7 Beats C FA; A Cml. Noses Sq. 8

A 20 yard scoring dash by J. McGee and a touchdown plunge and two conversions by B. Smith sparked Sq. 7 to a 14-0 Class A football win over C FA Wednesday as four of the five games played were won by shutouts. C FA failed to score a penetration.

Sq. 10, showing a strong ground game, rolled to an easy 18-0 conquest of AAA, Buzz Kennedy unreeling several nice runs. In this game also the losers failed to notch a penetration, meaning that they never crossed their opponent's 40 yard line.

A Cml. nosed out Sq. 8, 7-6, in the only contest in which both teams scored. A Eng. blanked Sq. 6, 6-0, and A Inf. shut out Sq. 14, 12-0.

James Wise plunked in five field goals in a 22-7 Sq. 6 basketball win over B FA. Puss Blocker, Dick Mahin, and Bill Hightower rounded out the scoring with four points each.

Sq. 5 scored a 13-11 court win over A FA, holding the losers scoreless throughout the second half. Sq. 8 rolled over AAA, 19-9, with Broussard bagging eight points. C FA beat Sq. 7, 6-3, in a tight defensive game, scoring all their points in the first half while holding Sq. 7 pointless.

A Sig. and A Inf. scored 2-1 tennis decisions over Sq. 3 and Sq. 14 A Sig. won by scores of 8-6, 6-8, 8-0, A Inf. by scores of 3-8, 8-1, 8-0.

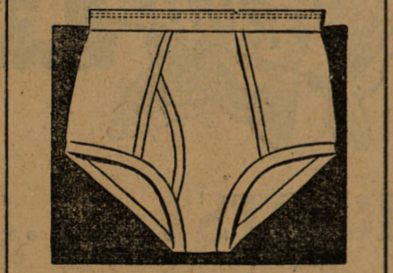
