

# Basketball Edges Into 'Mural Show; B Inf., A Ord. Winners

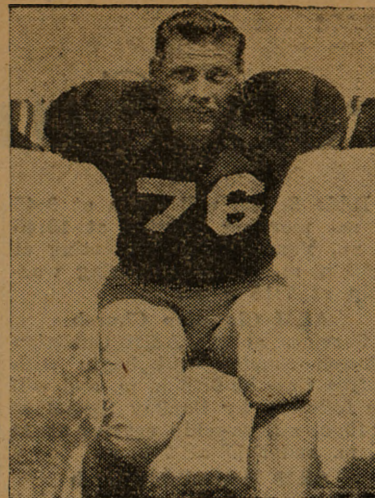
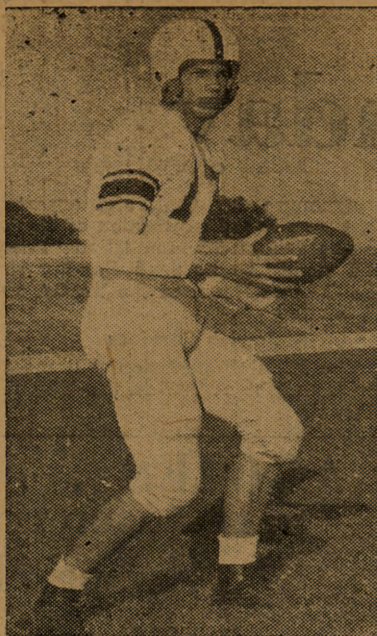
An eight point scoring barrage

G the verdict. A free throw by W. B. Neuman was Sq. 20's only scoring effort in the entire second half.

The coaching staffs for the Army-Air Force Corps Championship football game to be played Thursday, Dec. 18 at Kyle Field, have been announced.

Head coach for the Air Force will be Ray Graves, who will also tutor the offensive backs. Darrow Hooper will instruct the ends, Bobby Dixon the tackles, Dick Frey the guards, and Charlie Saxe the defensive backs.

For the Ground Force squad, Jack Little will be head coach and will handle the tackles. Walter Hill will take charge of the ends, Marshall Rush the guards, and Connie Magouirk the backs. Herb Scott will coach the defensive backs.

Money from gate receipts and concession sales will go to the Student Aid Fund, where students may borrow money on a non-interest pay-when-you-can basis.

An effort will be made to have classes on the day of the game end at 3 p. m. to eliminate changing mess hall schedules and using of game lights.

Ray George, Aggie head coach, has said he will make every effort to be at the game, and to announce the play-by-play. He said the purpose for the game was wonderful, and he had heard there was some good material in the intramural program.

The teams will have only two weeks to whip into shape, so it has been suggested that 12 1/2 minute quarters would be better than regular collegiate periods.

Plans call for the corps to buy 50 cent admission tickets from the first sergeant and march into the stadium area. Anyone not desiring to go will be allowed to stay in the dorm area and supervised drill will be held at the scheduled time.

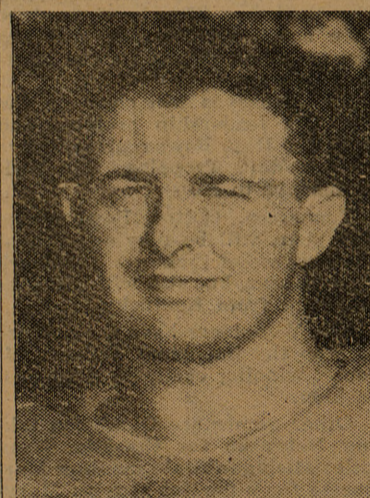
Barlow Irvin, athletic director, has consented to provide uniforms, dressing rooms, Kyle Field, and stadium lights, if needed.

However the Mustangs will meet the Baylor Bears Saturday in the Cotton Bowl and will find the Bears ruining their pipe dreams.

It should be a good game and high scoring as the Bears and Mustangs have the second and third best offensive units in the conference respectively. The difference between the teams is in the defense with the defensive honors belonging to the Baylor eleven.

Baylor has the second best pass defense in the SWC while the Mustangs are first in passing offense. The Bears are weak on rushing defense, but the Ponies haven't shown a consistent ground attack all year.
