## Named No. 1 Of 35 in U. S.

The A&M Student agronomy society has been rated "the best club in the United States" among the 34 such student chapters over the country for the school year 1951-52 by the American Society of Agronomy.

Standings of the student chapters during the past school year were announced Wednesday in Cincinnati, O., at the annual banquet of the national society.

Representatives of the Aggie chapter present at the banquet received a handsome trophy donated by the National Plant Food Council and \$100 toward their expenses in attending the meeting.

There are 70 active members of the A&M student agronomy chapter. Officers are Glenn Black of Mexia, president; M. H. Scieff of San Benito, vice president; B. L. Henderson of Waco, secretary; Leonard Thornton of Temple, treasurer; J. W. McDonald of Moody, parliamentarian; John P. Hitt of Raymondville, reporter. Faculty adviser is Prof. Clarence E. Watson.
