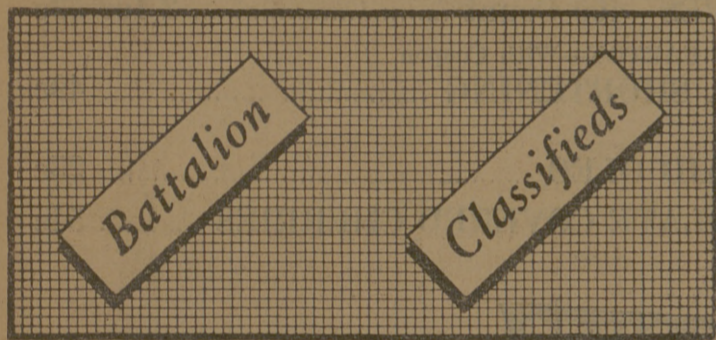
Dames Club Plans Christmas Party
