work on military radar had so crowded my mind with details of its operation that I looked for radar possibilities in everything I saw," he said.

"At any rate, as the flat Texas landscape rolled beneath the plane I was impressed by the possibilities of television and FM radio operation. Both have characteristics similar to radar, from an airplane, especially at the altitudes flown by Stratovision planes."

FCC Delayed Approval

In cooperation with the Glenn L. Martin Co., a converted B-29 was equipped for Stratovision. The plan worked as expected, but delay in getting a Federal Communications Commission license, coupled with the invention of the coaxial cable for transmitting television programs, caused the project to be shelved.

The theory behind the plan is now being used by the Army,

Navy, and Air Force in classified projects.
