

In honor of his singing, Melchoir has received decorations from sev-eral countries. He has received the commander Cross of Dannebrog, the Danish medal of "Ingenio et Arti," Knight Commander of the White Rose of Finland, and El Merito de Chile.

Other decorations include the French Legion of Honor and Of-ficer de l' Instruction Publique, Knighthoods of Bulgaria, Saxonia, and Coburg; as well as the Gold Medal from Vassar College for his contribution to music in America. He has also received the Grand Lodge of New York's Gold Medal for the most outstanding Free Mason of 1944.
