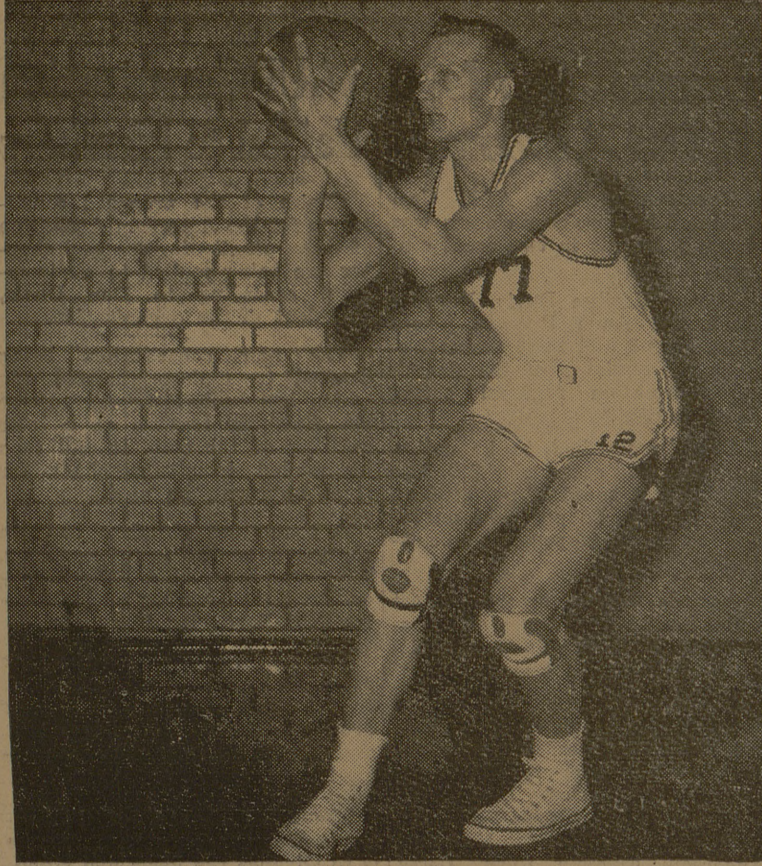

Leroy Miksch and Don Heft date for all-conference honors. His defensive game has been one of the outstanding features of the basketball season, and he bows to no one as a ball hawk and rebound ace.

Heft, a two year letterman, has been freedly used this year by Coach John Floyd to step up defensive or offensive tactics. He is one of the finest floor men on the Aggie squad, a good dribbler who has a keen knowledge of the game and a very handy player to have in reserve.

Needing a win over the Horned Frogs to insure a sixth place finish in the conference race, the Ags

will also be battling to eliminate the Frogs from title contention.

Returning for another year of competition for the Aggies will be Ken Murry, Bill Williams, Don Binford, James Galemore and James Addison.

Soph players are Don Moon, Bob Johnson, Rodney Pirtle, Pat McCrory, Joe Hardgrove and Roy Martin.

Added to this list of returning list will be at least two fine players from the fish squad, John Fortenberry and Eugene Brethauer have been outstanding players for a winless fish team.

Gunning for a berth in the state class A and AA will be eight teams this afternoon and evening.

Fairfield, a 70 to 51 victor over Columbus, and Cedar Bayou, vic-

tors over Mason, 60 to 53, appear to be the favorites in the class A conference, with Troup, conquerors of Hearne, 63-45, in the dark horse role.

In the AA class, Waxahachie and San Marcus look like the favorites, with Cameron a dark horse.

Gold basketballs will be given to the high scoring player of each class this evening after the final game at 8:30.

Those in the running for the class A leading scorer are, Aiden Forsythe of Cedar Bayou with 23 points; David Lott of Fairfield, with 21; Joe Cole of Troup with 19; Freddy Cochran of Cedar Bayou with 18; and Dean Ray Evans of Troup with 17.

The class AA high point men are, Tom Oglesby of Waxahachie with 28 points; Joe Rody of San Marcus with 22; Ray Thompson of Cameron with 17; and Frank Hooper of Waxahachie with 16.

Tonight's finals in class A will match the winner of the Troup-Cushing game against the winner of the Fairfield-Cedar Bayou contest. The Fairfield-Cedar Bayou tilt will probably decide the class A champ.

In class AA the finals will have the victor of the San Marcus-Livingston game matched with the winner of the Waxahachie-Cameron tilt.

The finals will start at 7 p.m.

INTRAMURAL HIGHLIGHTS

Gay, Cameron Vie; Davis Wins Match

Clarence Gay, Sq. 14, and Cameron, A Inf., vaulted into the finals of the 123 pound upperclassman division yesterday in intramural mat action. Defending upperclassman heavyweight champ Delbert Davis, Co. C, gained the heavyweight semifinals with a 25 second pin of Barnett, Maroon Band.

Storing up a 10-1 lead on points, Gay had little trouble as he took Haddock, ASA, in 3:47. Cameron notched a 2:31 fall from Condon, Sq. 4.

Taking a 2-0 lead on a take-down at 2:10, Johnson had to fight back in the last two minutes after De Wald knotted the score at 2-2 25 seconds later. Johnson scored the winning points on a near-fall at 3:50.

In a 137 pound bout Birkhead, Sq. 7, counted a 6-3 win over Boykin, White Band, to grab a semifinal berth against Rowland, Sq. 11. In the other semifinal Harrington, Maroon Band, fights Andrews, B FA, after taking a 9-6 decision from Croom, A Inf.
