

# College Station Churches Hold Easter Services

Holy Week services will be climaxed with special Easter services in many of the College Station churches Sunday.

Catholic services will be held at St. Joseph Catholic Church in Bryan Thursday, Friday, Saturday and Sunday.

Holy Thursday services will begin with Confessions and Holy Communion at 6:15 a. m. and will be followed by High Mass and Procession at 8:30 a. m. Throughout the day the parishioners will keep Adoration. Rosary and Sermon will begin at 7:30 p. m.

The beginning of Good Friday ceremonies is scheduled for 9 a. m. Friday. Agony of Christ on the

Cross is scheduled from noon until 3 p. m. The church will be left open until 9 p. m. No evening service will be held.


