Cars Collide Near New Area Last Night at 6

Cars driven by William W. Dadd, Rosenberg sophomore, and Henry Josephson of San Antonio, collided at 6 p.m. yesterday at the corner of Lub-

No one was injured. Dean of the College David H. Morgan and Commandant of Cadets Col. Joe E. Davis live at the intersection of the two streets near the upperclass corps area.

The cars, prior to the collision, were going north in the case of Josephson's vehicle and east in the case of Dadd's. The car Dadd was driving belonged to John Parker, freshman from Rosenberg.

The front ends of the two autos were badly smashed with perhaps \$150-200 worth of damage to each, said Campus Security Officer Ray Rosier, who investigated the crash along with Officer R. P. Patton.

Dadd's car skidded around ten yards just before the crash, said Rosier. Josephson's skidded about 15 yards, he added.

The radiator on Josephson's car was bent against the engine which kept the car from being started after the accident. Dadd's 1953 model was also immobilized by the crash and could not be put in gear, Rosier said.

Both drivers will be charged with exceeding the speed limit, said the officer. They were each going around 30 mph just before the collision, he said.

REQUEST METHOD PLANNED FOR RESERVING MSC ROOMS

The past two years the MSC has held a drawing the first two weeks in May to determine who the guest rooms would go to for the major events. This year the same procedure will be followed, and requests will be accepted May 1 through May 31, for the 1953-54 school year. The drawing will be held after the final May 31 date, to determine who will receive available accommodations.

PROCEDURE NECESSARY

The reservation request procedure is necessary because of the great demand for guest rooms during weekends of much local activity, so that all who desire rooms may have an equal chance to receive them. Reservation requests may be made out without giving the specific date if it is not known by designating the name of the event you wish to attend. To facilitate the drawing procedure, a separate request should be filed for each date a room in the MSC is desired. Restrictions placed on the overall request procedure maintain that only one room can be reserved for each event, and that the guest room reservations will not be transferable.

DEPOSIT IMPERATIVE

Following the drawings after the May 31 request deadline, confirmations will be mailed to the individuals whose names were drawn. A room deposit may be mailed to the Center at any time after the confirmations are received or by the specified time on the confirmations. Room deposits not received by two weeks prior to the desired date will result in automatic cancellation of the reservation. Individuals desiring accommodations may write, or personally make the request at the MSC desk between May 1 and May 31.
