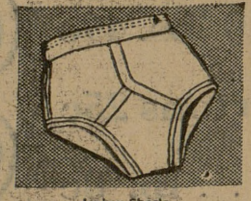

Track Team Meets Rice, Texas Today

The Aggie varsity and fish track squads compete this afternoon in a triangular meet with Rice and Texas in Austin.

With 33 fish entered in the various events, the total exceeds the 31 varsity competitors making the trip.

Darrow Hooper, Bobby Gross, and Dan Pratt make up the Aggie entries in the shot put and discus. If they turn in their usual performances, it is possible that they will finish one-two-three.

In the pole vault, Aggie strength is also pronounced, with Malcolm Marks besting the conference record on one occasion this year with a 14 ft. 2 1/2 inch leap. Glenn Spradlin and James Earle are both very capable vaulters who give the Cadets a chance for a sweep in the event.

Javelin Hurlers
Pete Mayeaux leads the javelin entries, with Tom Dollahite, George Knipple, and Roy Dollar due to take down points in the javelin.

The high jumpers are Marvin Swink and Thomas, both of whom are improving in every meet.

Bobby Ragsdale and Bill Stalter give the Aggies a strong double entry in the broad jump. Ragsdale has leaped over 25 feet this year and has his eye on the conference record of 24 feet, 9 3/4 inches, held by Hale of Rice, who set the mark in 1932. It is the oldest mark in the conference books.

Bears Top Handball Team; Four-Way Meet Saturday

John Centilli and the duo of Don Tabb and Jack Frey were A&M's only winners as the Aggie handball team lost to Baylor in Waco Tuesday night. The Aggies lost 5-1, in singles and split the doubles.

Centilli won his match by 21-15

440 Yard Dash Entries

Aggie representatives in the 440 yard dash will be James Baker, Carol Libby, Gerald Stull, and Frank Norris. This group will also run the mile relay, and may post a good time, since the relay team has been continually hampered by injuries, and is just now rounding into shape.

Running in the half mile event will be Edwin Wilmsen, Wallace Kleb, and Bob Collins. In this event the Aggies will run into good competition, since both Texas and Rice have very good half milers.

Charles Hudgins, Dale DeRouen, and Harry Whitmore in the mile run will give the Maroon and White a good share of the points in that race.

Blaine After Mark

The two mile run features James Blaine, who will be battling to break the conference mark in that event. Blaine can't officially break the record this afternoon, since conference marks can only be set in the SWC meet, but he should give some idea of what to expect next week, by the race he runs this afternoon. Franklin White-well is the other Aggie entry in the two mile run.

Hurdlers will be Glenn Blake, Harley Hartung, H. A. Smith, Ragsdale, and Dollahite. An interesting race is in prospect between this group and Scallorn of Texas.

Softball Team Plays

The Aggie softball team will play the Marlin Bathers on the lighted diamond at 8 p. m. Saturday in a doubleheader.

Marlin is the former Calvert All-Stars who won the National Softball Congress world championship in Phoenix in 1951.
