NOTICE OF HEARING ON ZONING
 Notice is hereby given that a hearing will be held in the City Hall of the City of College Station, Texas, at 7 p.m. on June 15, 1953, on the recommendations of the Zoning Commission for zoning properties, as provided in Ordinance No. 38, respectively as follows:
 I. The following described property shall be added to and made a part of District 1 as defined in Section 5 of Ordinance No. 38, the zoning ordinance of the City of College Station, Texas:
 a. Blocks 9, 10, 11, 12, of the Oak Terrace Addition
 b. Lots A, B, C, and D as shown on city map 2-5-52 of the Tauber Addition
 c. All lots not already zoned in S.E. College Park Addition
 d. All lots not already zoned in Breezy Heights Addition
 II. The following described property shall be added to and made a part of District 2 as defined in Section 6 of Ordinance No. 38, the zoning ordinance of the City of College Station, Texas:
 a. Blocks 2, 4, and Blocks 1, 3 and any portion of these blocks which have been

heretofore zoned, and that portion of Blocks 5, 6 not already zoned as No. 4 of the Tauber Addition
 b. All lots not already zoned of the Coomer Addition
 c. All lots of Blocks R, C, D, E, F, and G except Lot 12 of Block B and Lots 3, 4 of Block F of the Ringhoffer Addition
 d. All lots of Blocks A, B, C, D, E, F, G, and H of the land whose boundaries begin at the S.W. corner of the intersection of Fairview and Luther Streets thence S.E. along the S.W. side of Fairview Street to a point opposite the property line between lots 20, 21 in Block 3 of Breezy Heights Addition, thence S.W. at right angles to Fairview Street to the intersection of the N.W. side of Montclair Avenue extended, thence N.W. along the S.W. side of Montclair Street extended to the intersection of Luther Street, thence N.E. along the S.E. side of Luther Street to the beginning of the Hrdlicka Addition

other three sides by unnamed streets, Frank Thomas store presently located in this area.
 c.  V. The following described property shall be added to and made a part of District 5 as defined in Section 9 of Ordinance No. 38, the zoning ordinance of the City of College Station, Texas:
 a. The area of land bounded on the N.E. by State Highway 6, on the N.W. by A&M College property line, on the S.W. by a line 140' N.E. of the center line of Meadowland Street and parallel to the extension thereof, and on the S.E. by the N.W. boundary line of the present No. 4 Business area, of the Goryski Addition.  In 1952 Sadler became president of the Association of American Colleges. At the first meeting of the World Council of Churches in Amsterdam, Holland, he represented the Disciples of Christ. He is now a director of this church council.
 Sadler is a 32nd degree Scottish Rite and Shrine Mason. He was named Knight Commander of the Court of Honor in 1947.
