NOTICE OF HEARING ON ZONING. Notice is hereby given that a hearing will be held in the City Hall of the City of College Station, Texas, at 7 p.m. on June 15, 1953 on the recommendations of the Zoning Commission for zoning properties, as provided in Ordinance No. 38, respectively as follows:
I. The following described property shall be added to and made a part of District 1 as defined in Section 5 of Ordinance No. 38, the zoning ordinance of the City of College Station, Texas:
a. Blocks 9, 10, 11, 12, of the Oak Terrace Addition
b. Lots A, B, C, and D as shown on city map 2-5-52 of the Tauber Addition
c. All lots not already zoned in S.E. College Park Addition
d. All lots not already zoned in Breezy Heights Addition
II. The following described property shall be added to and made a part of District 2 as defined in Section 6 of Ordinance No. 38, the zoning ordinance of the City of College Station, Texas:

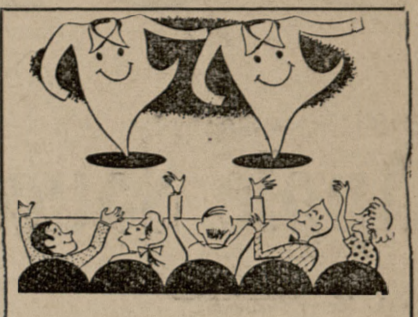
