

Ag Track Stars Enter NCAA Nebraska Meet

Five Texas Aggie trackmen and their two coaches will be in Lincoln, Neb., this week for the annual NCAA Friday and Saturday (June 19 and 20).

Coach Frank G. Anderson and Ray Putnam, assistant, left early this week along with Weightmen, Darrow Hooper and Bobby Gross; Malcolm Marks, pole vaulter; Jim Blaine, two-miler and Bobby Ragsdale, low hurdler and broad jumper.

One of the undefeated A&M team's top aces—James Baker—will not enter the NCAA due to summer ROTC camp commitments. Hooper and Gross will enter the shot put and discus. Hooper won the NCAA shot title as a sophomore in 1951 but lost to Perry O'Brien, the Olympic champ and world record holder, in 1952. O'Brien has bettered the 59 foot mark twice this spring.

Stadium Seating To Be Finished For Fall Games

The Kyle Field seating capacity expansion program will be completed for the first home game, September 26, 1953, said 'Bones' Irwin, A&M Athletic Director.

Irwin said that construction on the addition of 2,476 seats and 178 boxes to Kyle Field is on schedule, but the press box will not be completed until later in the season.

This expansion will extend from 30 yard line to 30 yard line on the west side of the stadium and will be 32 rows high above and behind the present stadium.

In order to raise enough funds for the seating capacity expansion, a 20 year registered ticket purchase option was proposed by the Athletic Council. Options are available at \$50.00, per option, to former students who have first chance until Nov. 1, at which time they will be offered to the general public.

Coaching Staff Completed, Walls As Assistant Coach

(Spl)—With the signing of Willie Walls as an assistant coach last week the Texas Aggies now have their 1953 coaching staff at top strength.

Walls is the seventh coaching aid for 1953 and the third new mentor hired since the 1952 season closed.

The former TCU great of the mid-thirties will assist with the

freshmen and will be a game scout.

Two other new staff members are Line Coach Mike Michalske, formerly of Baylor, who replaces Paul McMurtry and Willie Zapalac, who succeeds Cooper Robbins, Sr.

The hold-over coaches are Head Coach Ray George, Dalton Faircloth, offensive backfield coach; Gil Steinke, defensive backfield coach; and Bill Duncan, end coach. All seven Aggie coaches have played professional football, with the exception of Faircloth.

Irvin played two years with Buffalo; George played with the Detroit Lions and the Los Angeles Bulldogs; Steinke with the Philadelphia Eagles; Duncan with Long Island; Walls with the New York Giants; Zapalac with the Pittsburgh Steelers and Michalske with the Green Bay Packers.

George will begin his third year this fall while Steinke and Faircloth will start their fourth seasons at A&M. Duncan will begin his second season next September while Irvin starts his fifth year as athletic director. He previously served at A&M as line coach and freshmen coach.

Zapalac, Walls and Michalske have not coached at A&M previously.

Football Records Show A&M Power

A&M has played 505 football games in 58 seasons since 1894. The Aggies have compiled a record of 305 games won, 164 lost and 36 tied against 80 opponents. Also, A&M teams have participated in six bowl games, winning 6 and losing 4. The Aggies have played in the Dixie Classic, Sugar Bowl, Orange Bowl and Presidential Cup contests once each and the Cotton Bowl twice.

C. S. Eagles Play The Mexia Oilers

New Press Box Will Be Ready On Turkey Day

Turkey Day is the date set for completion of the new press box for Kyle Field Stadium, announced 'Bones' Irwin, A&M Athletic Director.

An improved structure will serve as the press box during the 1953 football season until the new press box is completed said Irwin.

The accommodations for the press box will cost in the neighborhood of \$80,000. Funds for this structure will be furnished by the A&M Athletic Department, which has pledged itself to furnish the money needed.

The new press box will be modern in every respect and will be modeled after those press boxes at Baylor and the University of Oklahoma.

Equipped with an outside elevator, the press box will be 140 feet long and will furnish accommodations for 108 working newspaper men.

Composed of three levels of booths the new press box will give A&M press facilities and accommodations that will compare with the best to be found anywhere in the country, Irwin said.
