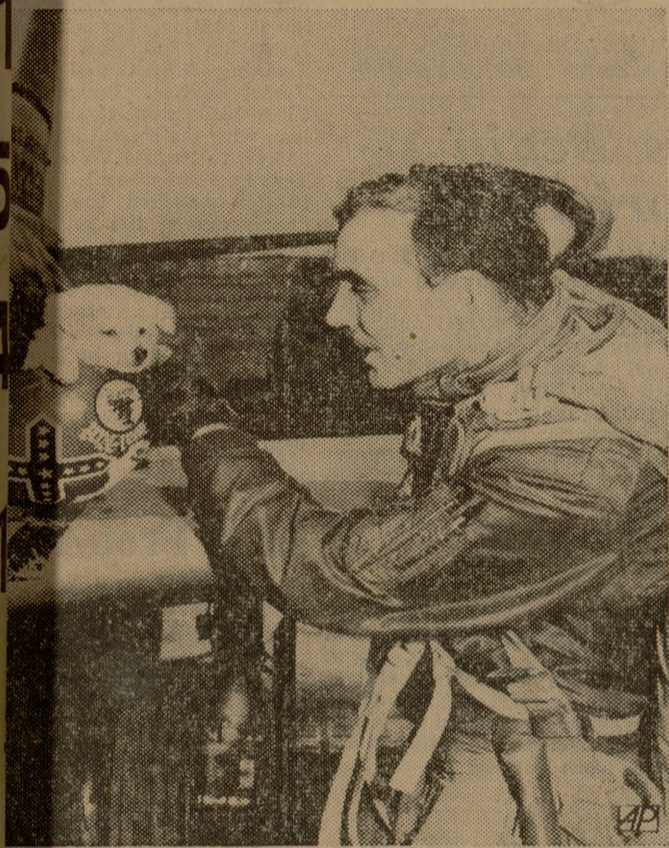


Soothing Rains Lift County Outlook
