• The court may recommend that the person be given an official written reprimand by the Commandant with a copy to be forwarded to his parents or guardian.

• It may recommend that the person be restricted to the campus r company area for a period not exceeding four and one half months. This restriction cannot prevent the person from meeting classes or military formations or entering the mess hall for the purpose of eating meals or leaving the campus on authorized holidays. Restricted personnel will be recer of the Day at specified hours.

• Extra duty tours, commonly known at A&M as "the bullring," may be recommended for all cadets brought before the court except cadet officers and noncommissioned officers of the first four grades. Those cadets receiving sentences who are not subject to extra duty tours will report hourly to the Cadet Officer of the Day.
