Five games are on slate for Southwest Conference teams this veekend. Two of these tilts are billed as the most attractive of the weekend.

California is rated a one touchdown favorite over Baylor in a bat-tle of the Bears at Berkely, Cal. The Rice Owls, tagged as pre-season favorites to win the conference title, are seven point picks over a Florida team billed as one of the top outfits of the country.

In other league intersectional games, Texas is favored over LSU, TCU is picked over Kansas and Kentucky is given the nod over A&M.

Around 50,000 fans are expected Around 50,000 fans are expected to witness the Baylor-Cal tilt. Baylor's starting backfield of Quarterback Fran Davidson, Halfbacks Jerry Coody and L. G. Dupre and Fullback Allen Jones is rated one of the best in the nation. California has never lost a season opener under Coach Lynn Waldorf

Florida fans expect one of the
best teams in the school's history. Back Rick Casares and Guard Joe D'Agostino are on many pre-sea-son All-American teams.

Casares was badly injured in a summer auto accident. He will see little if any action. In 1952 he ran for 632 yards and completed 14 of 37 passes for an amazing 781 yards. He scored seven touch-downs and had a 41.2 punting aver-

D'Agostino is a 5 feet 11, 218 pound senior. He charges like an elephant and wrecked Tulsa's famed Howard Waugh in the last

Gator Bowl game. Texas, minus three fourths of 1952's brilliant secondary, still has Billy Quinn and Carleton Massey, along with a flock of flashy sophomore backs.

Quinn set a new scoring record for sophs with 13 touchdowns. He scored three against Baylor and counted seven of Texas' last 11.

The Longhorns beat LSU 35-14 last season. Tomorrow's game should be much closer. The Bengal Tigers return three all-conference linemen and three of their first four ball carriers.

TCU plays its first game under new coach and a new offensive setup against a team with a very strong defensive line. Tackle Bud Bixler, 6 feet 5, 232, Guard Bud Hantla, 206, and Paul Leoni are due to deal misery to the Frogs Split-T and Single Wing attack. The Frogs rate the nod because of their fine backfield of Ray Mc-Kawn, Roy Fraley, Ronald Clink-scale and Danny Hallmark.


