The 46-year-old winner, a staunch friend of the United States, becomes the third President of this 7-year-old republic. He is to take office Jan. 1 for a four-year term. Each flush valve costs \$11. Dormitory 7 is the seventh dormitory which vandels have flooded ince school started. Each time lush valves have been taken from toilets. This has caused water to rush from the pipes and flow into the halls.

Water still covered parts of dormitory 7 late last night.

The valves were removed on the third floor. C. H. (Clancy) Woliver, commander of A Quartermaster, said he awoke at 4 a. m.
