That one exception is the track teams of Col. Frank G. Anderson and Ray Putnam.

In the past seven seasons, the track boys have won the conference title six times—a pretty fair batting average.

Yet, in Saturday's issue of the Houston Post, Jack Gal-lagher wrote that "A&M's method of awarding full track scholarships on the basis of a first in the Southwest conference meet, four-fifths of a scholarship for second place, etc., is responsible for the Aggies' DECLINE in the sport.'

That word DECLINE was a big slip, but it wasn't even the first one. The headline read, "Aggies Tie Up Scholar-ships And the Track Team Suffers."

The real fact is that A&M does NOT tie up its track scholarships:


'Mural Officers **To Meet Thursday**


This is a very important meet-ing and all officers are urged to be present, said Barney Welch, director of intramural athletics.
