

Cougars Beat Aggies 52-51 Big Boys Tops In 'Mural Wrestling

James Addison's great offensive work and Pat McCrory's leach-like guarding were in vain last night as the Houston Cougars came

from behind in the final seconds to edge the Aggies, 52-51.

The game was the final home appear for Coach John Floyd's Cougars who close out the season next Monday night against Baylor in Waco.

Addison's 16 points was high for the game. The only senior on the club now has fired 120 points in the past five games and is second only to Rice's Gene Schwinger in Southwest conference points.

Wrestling Team Sets First Tilt

A&M's wrestlers square off in the first match of the year against Texas University in DeWare Field House Saturday afternoon at 3:00 p.m. This will be the sixth time that A&M has faced the Longhorns in wrestling during the past three years, with the Aggies coming out on top five times to the Longhorns one win.

A&M's hopes will rest on the shoulders of the two returning lettermen who have won berths on the hotly contested squad this year. These men: Dick Cappel and Rudy Henson have both done yeoman work for the Aggies in their wrestling careers.

Cappel is the only member of the team who has had experience in high school wrestling. Although a native of Honduras, Cappel attended high school at Holy Cross in New Orleans and with his teammates won the Louisiana State High School Wrestling Tournament. McCrory did a great defensive job on Jack Mosher, Houston's high-scoring ace for the first 35 minutes of the game. Mosher ended up with 12 points but six of them were in the final two minutes

of the night—put Houston within one point with 27 seconds remaining and then ahead with 16 seconds left.

The Aggies had a good shooting night hitting 20 of 50 field goal attempts for an even 40 percent. The visitors hit 16 of 75 for a scant 21 percent. Houston hit 20 of 21 free throws. A&M connected 11 times in 19 attempts from the free lane.

Houston's taller Cougars dominated the board, grabbing 48 rebounds to 42 for A&M. Addison was brilliant, here too, reaching for 18 rebounds.
