

## Southern Speaks To Methodist Men

Hoyle Southern, professor of agricultural economics, spoke to the A&M Methodist Mens Brother-

hood Tuesday night on Pakistan, its people and its problems. About 25 men attended the monthly supper. Aden Magee, president, introduced Prof. Southern to the group.

Prof. Southern has been a member of two U. S. government food and agricultural missions to Pakistan. He showed slides to illustrate his comments on the people and the country.

According to Prof. Southern, Pakistan is held together as a nation largely through the religious tie, most of the people being members of the Moslem faith. Largely on this religious basis, Prof. Southern pointed out, Pakistan consists of east and west Pakistan, the one separated from the other by over 1,000 miles with India and its people intervening.
