Polio Vaccinations Not Set for Brazos

Brazos county was not one of the counties selected to receive the new vaccine against polio, said Dr. E. S. Frieman, director of the Brazos county health unit.

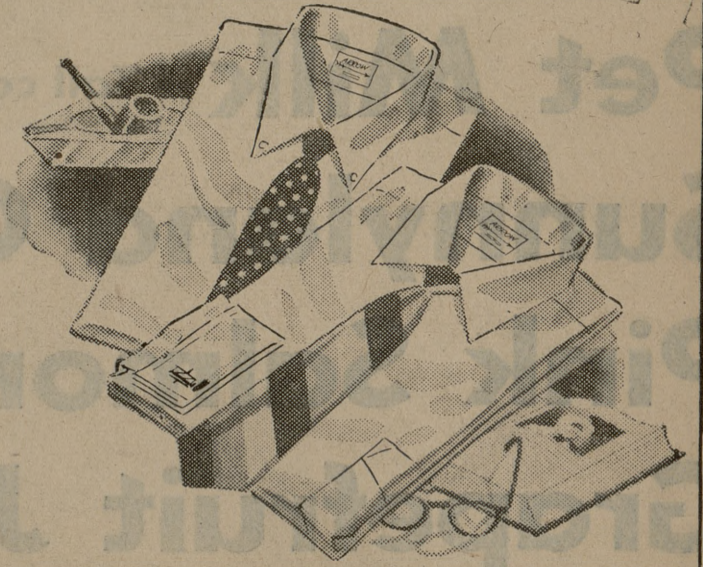
