Local Swimmers Sweep Tulsa Meet

Two College Station swimmers swept the Oklahoma Open swimming meeting in Tulsa Saturday. The swimmers, Richard Weick and John Harrington, swam against 175 contestants from eight states in the two-day meet. Richard, who was entered in the men's division, was first in the 200 meter individual medley, with a time of 2:46.6 minutes. He was second in the 100 meter butterfly breaststroke with the time of 1:13.7 minutes. He was third in the 100 meter backstroke. He was fourth in both the 400 meter freestyle and the 1,500 meter freestyle. John Harrington, who entered the boys' classification of 14 and under, was first in the 100 meter backstroke, timed at 1:18.7 minutes. He was also first in the 200 meter individual medley, with a time of 3:08.5. The meet was held in the new Olympic pool at Tulsa.

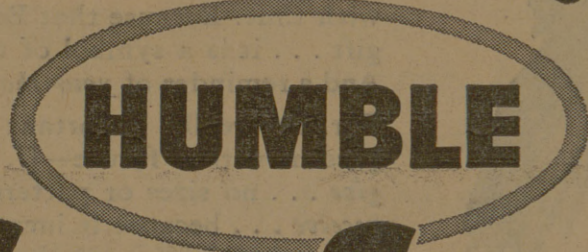
